

Energy: Mid Wales projects move into prototype stage to deliver real-world clean energy solutions

The Whole System Research for Innovation and Decarbonisation (WSRID) programme in Mid Wales has now entered its prototype phase, thanks to new funding from the Welsh Government. Building on feasibility work earlier this year, three projects — HARVEST, LAFAN and W2W — will move into real-world testing of clean energy systems designed for rural communities, agriculture and dairy farming. These initiatives will explore ideas such as community energy sharing, slurry-to-biogas and modular farm energy systems, all with the aim of designing scalable, low-emission solutions across Mid Wales.

This phase marks a key step in turning innovation into action; over the next year the prototypes will be refined and results prepared for rollout in 2026. The work highlights how collaboration between local farms, communities, researchers and government can deliver practical pathways to a greener, fairer energy future for Mid Wales.

Careers in 360: Bringing career pathways to life across Mid Wales

Growing Mid Wales and the Mid Wales Regional Skills Partnership is excited to present the <u>Careers in 360</u> portal — an innovative digital careers platform developed in collaboration with One Step North and key public sector organisations, including universities, colleges, and schools across Wales — has been live since 1 November and has already attracted over 2,000 visitors. Rollout to schools across Ceredigion and Powys is now underway, offering learners an immersive and interactive look at the world of work.

Students can explore over 250 career roles across 23 industry sectors, from digital and engineering to creative industries, healthcare, construction and more — all through engaging 360° video content, virtual workplace tours and "day in the life" experiences

What makes Careers in 360 different:

O Personalised pathways: A 'Right For Me' quiz helps learners match their strengths and interests to potential careers.

Real-world insights: 360° workplace tours, short video stories, and interactive virtual booths bring jobs to life.


Comprehensive resources: Detailed job profiles outline responsibilities, required skills, typical wages and qualification routes.

● Fully accessible: Available on desktop, tablet, mobile and VR — and bilingual in Welsh and English.

While the portal has been designed for young people, it's also a powerful tool for teachers, parents, career advisers and also adults considering a career change — helping users explore opportunities and understand the skills employers are looking for.

Early use in schools is already showing how the platform can spark curiosity, build confidence and help young people understand the opportunities waiting for them in Mid Wales.

A dedicated 'World of Work 360' section — an immersive virtual careers fair connected to Careers in 360 — is being built to strengthen the visibility of SMEs across Mid Wales on the platform. As part of this, plans are progressing for a Mid Wales directory, , which will showcase businesses from across the region.

The Mid Wales business directory, where companies can provide information about their business free of charge for a 12-month trial period, gives them a new way to reach learners, jobseekers and the wider community.

Mid Wales Commercial Property Investment Fund – Update



Mid Wales Commercial Property Investment Fund




The Mid Wales Commercial Property Investment Fund, which launched on 1 May 2025, is designed to be simple and accessible — supporting established (mainly local) businesses to develop, extend or repurpose commercial premises to unlock growth across the region.

The Fund is designed to back projects that will help grow Mid Wales' commercial property offer — from developing new premises (including infrastructure and utilities) to extending, refurbishing, retrofitting, or converting existing buildings for business use.

After a successful Open Call and Viability Stage, which saw 54 enquiries and 22 formal submissions, we're delighted to share that nine companies have now been invited to submit full 'Developed Bids'. There high-quality proposals demonstrated strong strategic fit, deliverability, financial viability, and potential impact.

The nine projects cover a cross-section of Mid Wales' business base:





Motor trade – 2 projects

This mix reflects the Fund's focus to support growth across key sectors that underpin the region's economy — from advanced manufacturing and construction to essential services and supply chains.

Here's a snapshot of the Fund's progress so far:

22 Viability Proposals submitted (100% return rate)

9 projects now advancing to the Development Stage

7 projects placed on a reserve list due to budget constraints

7 projects in Powys, 2 in Ceredigion

Combined project value: ~£11.12 million

Estimated Fund contribution: ~£3.96 million

2 112 new jobs proposed and 235 existing jobs to be safeguarded

10,394 sqm of new commercial floorspace to be created

The Development Stage will run over the coming months, with final assessments expected to conclude early in 2026. We extend our congratulations to the successful applicants and look forward to supporting them as they develop and refine the detail of their proposals. If successful, these projects will move into delivery soon after, helping to boost employment, unlock new workspace, and strengthen Mid Wales' commercial infrastructure.

Shared Prosperity Fund news from the region

Across Ceredigion, Shared Prosperity Fund (SPF) activity continues to support local enterprise and community engagement. SBARC Ceredigion has welcomed 20 new entrepreneurs onto its programme, helping to nurture early-stage business ideas and build local capacity for innovation. SPF funding has also supported a range of community events, including this year's lantern parade and lantern-making workshops delivered by Small World Theatre, bringing residents together and adding to the county's cultural offer. Work is also

underway to prepare for the transition year of the UK Shared Prosperity Strategic Fund, which will guide delivery arrangements from 2026.

In Powys, SPF-funded programmes continue to make strong progress. The Powys Business Capital Grants — which offer up to £25,000 to help local businesses invest, modernise and grow — have now moved through the assessment stage. Further updates on the outcome of applications will be shared soon.

This ongoing support is helping businesses build resilience, boost productivity and create new opportunities across the county, contributing to wider economic growth across Mid Wales.

A team of researchers led by Aberystwyth University is undertaking new research into the state of rural enterprise in Wales, funded by the UK Government through the Cymru Wledig Local Policy and Innovation Partnership (LPIP) Rural Wales initiative.

The study aims to build a clearer picture of the unique pressures facing rural businesses from post-pandemic recovery to changing markets, consumer behaviour, and the journey to net zero — and how these compare to their urban counterparts.

Local Growth Fund for Wales Consultation

The UK and Welsh Governments have launched a consultation on the future Local Growth Fund for Wales — the programme intended to follow UK Shared Prosperity Fund from April 2026.

This is an opportunity to shape how future economic development and regeneration funding is designed and delivered in Wales — including how it can support our communities, businesses and places here in Mid Wales.

As highlighted in the Welsh Government's Written Statement, the intention is to ensure a smooth transition from UKSPF to a new long-term funding approach that supports regional priorities and local delivery.


We encourage partners across the region — local authorities, businesses, skills and training providers, community groups and regional organisations — to attend and contribute.
